Press each seam as it is sewn

Finished size: Approximately 22 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 57"



MATERIALS AND CUTTING -

Jelly Roll and Charm Pack friendly!

Cream Print: ½ yard

Cut 5 - 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips the full width of 42/44" fabric (WOF)

Black Polka dot Fabric: ½ yard Cut 5 -2 ½" strips WOF

Green Print: 5/8 yard (includes enough fabric for binding)

Cut 7 squares $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ "

Red Print: ½ yard

Cut 20 squares $4\frac{1}{2}$ " x $4\frac{1}{2}$ " Black Floral Print: 5/8 yard Cut 2 squares 4" x 4"

Cut diagonally to make half-square triangles



Cut 6 squares 7" x 7"

Cut diagonally twice to make quarter-square triangles




Backing: 1 ³/₄ Yard

Binding: Cut 5 - 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " or 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips WOF


Assembly -

- Sew cream print and black polka dot 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips together lengthwise, pressing seams toward the cream print
- 2. Make 40 4-patches by laying the sewn strips with right sides together and cross-cutting into 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " length as shown here:




3. Press the seams to one side. If necessary, true up to 4 ½" squares.


- 4. Laying everything out: The table runner is made with a variation of the Trip-Around-the-World setting.
- 5. Arrange the 4-patches on point in 4 rows of 10 4-patches each. Lay them out so that cream print squares are next to black polka dot squares and vice versa as shown in the diagram.



Next, fill in with the 7 green print squares centered down the middle of the table runner.



Then, fill in the next "round" of spaces with the 20 red print squares.



- Lastly, place the half-square triangles on the corners, and the quarter-square triangles along the sides of the table runner.
- 9. Starting in one corner, sew the corner triangle to the adjacent 4-patch. Press seam toward the corner triangle.
- 10. Next, sew the setting triangles to either side of the 4patch to complete the first diagonal row. Press seams toward the setting triangles.
- 11. Continue across the quilt, sewing the diagonal rows together in the order that they are laid out. Be sure the 4-patches are sewn into the rows in exactly the same orientation as they are laid out.
- 12. Press seams toward the 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares and setting
- 13. Stitch the finished rows together as you go along to keep the 4-patches in the correct place. Press seams to one
- 14. Layer with batting and backing fabric and quilt by hand or machine.
- 15. Bind using your favorite method.
