Quilt Size: 64" x 70" Block Size: 5" finished

CUTTING:

Large Scale Prints:

Cut 30 - 5.5" squares

Cut 6 - 8 3/8" Squares

Cut on diagonal both ways for setting triangles

Cut 2 - 4.5" Squares

Cut on diagonal once for corner triangles

Small Scale Prints:

Cut 42 - 3.5" squares

Cut 168 - 1.5" squares small prints

Background Prints:

Cut 168 - 1.5" x 3.5"

Applique: (Add seam allowance for needle turn applique)

Cut 96 - leaf shapes from green ANTE 417G

Cut 8 - leaf shapes and 4 circles from ANTE 421X

Cut 4 - star shapes from ANTE 418R

Cut 4 - 3/8" x 18" of ANTE 419Z for stems

Cut 4 - 3/8" x 9" of ANTE 419Z for stems

Borders:

Cut 6 - 6" x 42" of ANTE 421EZ for first border

Cut 16 - 3.25 Squares of ANTE 421EZ for border cornerstone Blocks

Cut 4 - 6" Squares of ANTE 417N for border cornerstone blocks

Cut 4 - 4" x 62" ANTE 415B (This is cut the lengthwise way)

PIECED BLOCK CONSTRUCTION

Each block will consist of:

4 - 1.5" small print squares


1 - 3.5" small print square4 - 1.5" x 3.5" background rectangles

1. Join four 1.5" squares to two 1.5" x 3.5" rectangles. Press toward squares.

2. Sew two 1.5" x 3.5" rectangles to one 3.5" square,

as shown. Press toward Square.


3. Join the three rows.Block should measure5.5" square.Make 42.



QUILT CENTER CONSTRUCTION

Since this quilt has blocks set on point, you must sew the rows diagonally as shown below. The first row has only the corner triangle, the second has two setting triangles and a pieced block and so on. There is a total of fourteen diagonal rows. See diagram on last page.

Press following the arrows.



BORDER CORNERSTONES


1. Draw a diagonal line on the BACK of all 16 of the 3.25" ANTE 421 EZ squares.



2. Place one 3.25" square on the top right hand corner of a 6" ANTE 417 N, right sides together as shown.



3. Sew on drawn line.



4. Cut 1/4" from sewn line as shown,



5. Press toward outer corner.



6. Repeat on opposite corner, then both remaining corners.



Notice that you have a 1/4" seam allowance on all four sides.






BORDER APPLIQUE


You may use any technique you wish to finish the applique. The templates given DO NOT include a seam allowance for turned edge applique.

- 1. Measure for the length of the first border. The long side should be approximately 49.5" and the short side about 42.5. Cut and piece these pieces to your measurements from the 6" ANTE 421EZ pieces.
- 2. By folding the 6" border pieces in half, both ways to create a center point, you have a way to keep the applique centered.



3. Lay out the applique as shown. Notice that half the leaves at the center of each spray are tipped away from the stem at a greater angle.






The final construction is shown below. Follow the pressing arrows.

For the outer border, be sure to attach the side borders first, pressing to the outside.



Applique Leaves - ½ yard

End Leaves and Circles - 1/8 yard

Stars - 1/8 yard Stems - 1/8 yard

First Border - 1 1/4 yard Corner Blocks - 1/4 yard

Second Border - 2 yards

BINDING - 1/2 yard

BACKING - 4 yards


