



This is the Feathered Star Quilt Block that I hand pieced. This is the same style quilt block that I use for my Business Logo on our website and pattern covers. I have had many requests for this pattern and in the files provided on our website, you will find the block templates and the cutting diagrams in separate PDF files. All files can be found on the "Free Patterns" link on our website (exactly where you found this file, listed right below it if you are printing this pattern information directly from our website!) Pattern templates and cutting diagrams ONLY are provided. I did not write up instructions or anything else.

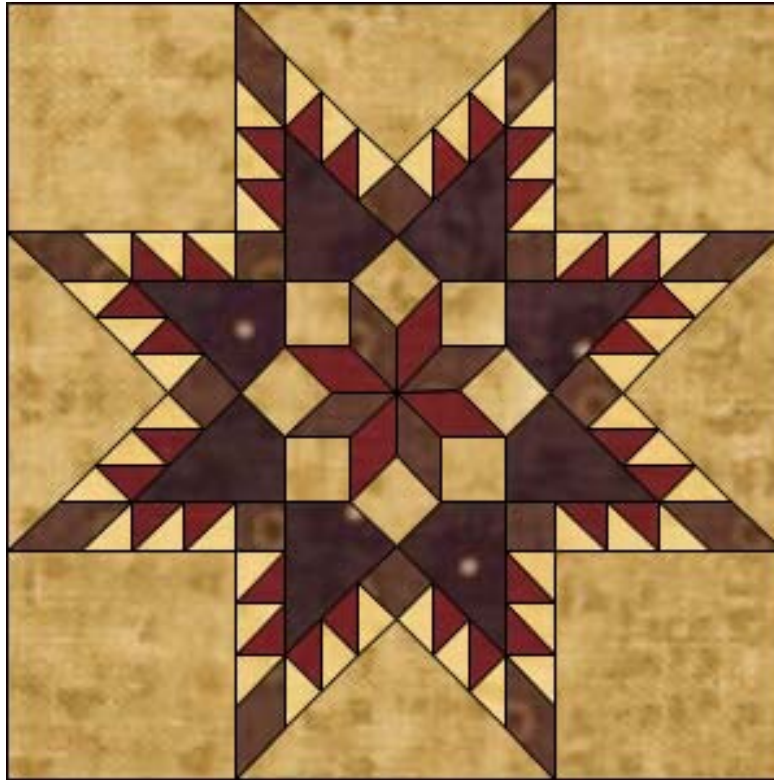
I chose to hand piece my quilt block because that is what I enjoy doing and I wanted to avoid cutting a lot of intricate pieces to exact sizes. There are lots of 8th and 16th cutting increments if you choose to cut with a rotary cutter and piece on your sewing machine.

Try hand piecing - it is so relaxing and I love the way my block turned out!

Here is a close up image so that you can see the fabric choices I made!



Here is the image of the block drawn up and colored in Electric Quilt:



Please remember when printing the template pieces to choose "print to actual size" on your printer when given the option!

This block will measure 21" finished size if you following the cutting diagrams provided from Electric Quilt. I chose to make my block a little bigger by cutting the outside set in corner blocks to 9" square. I also cut two 9 1/2" blocks for the inset triangle pieces on the top, bottom and sides and cut each of these squares in half on the diagonal once. After those pieces were sewn into place, I then squared up my block to measure 22 1/2" square. I like using larger pieces of fabric to make my feathered star appear more like it's floating in the background fabric. I also wanted a little more space for hand quilting around the feathered star when I get to that point!

This block design is one of the general patterns provided by Electric Quilt. I did not draw this pattern up nor am I the original creator of the block. I simply colored it the way I like it, hand pieced one and use it for my business logo!
