Barrette and Pin Pattern!

Ladies start your glue guns! This is a quick & easy project that makes great use of small scraps that you love and must find a use for!

To get started gather a few supplies:

- pin backs or barrette backs (depending on which you are doing)
- needle nose pliers
- felt squares or smaller pieces cut into flowers and leaves of different sizes
- buttons for flower centers
- jewels or gemstones for flower centers
- ribbon scraps for leaves and bows
- small felted balls and leaves
- "loops" for making potholders (tie a loop in the middle and use as a leaf)
- tulle - of course!!



If you have lace, charms, or paper leaves they are great too!



1. Begin by attaching a base to the barrette or pin back. It could be a strip of ribbon that covers the barrette base or a felt circle to cover the pin back base. Do this with your hot glue gun.

2. Next I sculpture any felt flowers or leaves I'm going to use. To do this put a small amount of hot glue in the middle of a flower and with a pair of needle nose pliers pinch the flower center to keep the flower from being flat.



3. While the flowers are drying, I add one of our tulle poofs. And we just happen to sell the instructions for tulle poofs in one of our flashcard sets at bridgetandlucy.com :). But any shape of tulle that looks good to you on top of your base will work great!

4. Starting in the middle, with the largest element start attaching elements to the base with hot glue.

5. Have smaller elements "peak" through leaves and petals of larger elements.

HINT: Don't be afraid to really layer elements & keep them tight and dimensional. The only thing that keeps this from being fabulous is if it's flat.



6. Once there are plenty of flowers and leaves begin adding buttons, jewels, felted balls, bugs, lace and ribbon for more texture and dimension.

These make great party favors, bows on gifts, or hostess gifts.
