

# Quilting the Kaye Wood Way

## Shades of the Southwest

*Fussy-Cut your favorite fabric or embroidery designs inside three different sized circles.*

Each circle is interfaced for a smooth finished edge.

### Fussy cut three 8" circles:

1. Center the fabric design within the opening of the 8" View & Do Circle.
2. Rotary cut around the 8" View & Do Circle.

### Fussy cut three 6" circles:

1. Center the fabric design within the 6" opening of the 8" View & Do Circle.
2. Place the 6" View & Do Circle inside the 8" opening. Remove the 8" View & Do Circle.
3. Rotary cut around the 6" View & Do Circle.

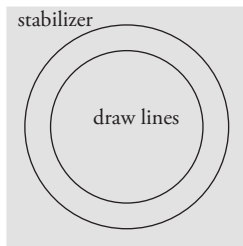


### Fussy cut three 4" circles:

1. Center the fabric design within the 4" opening of the 6" View & Do Circle.
2. Place the 4" View & Do Circle inside the 6" opening. Remove the 6" View & Do Circle.
3. Rotary cut around the 4" View & Do Circle.

### Interfacing:

1. For the 8" circles, cut nine 9" square of interfacing.
2. Draw around the inside and outside of the 8" View & Do Circle Shape.
3. For the 6" circle, cut six 7" squares of interfacing.
4. Draw around the inside and outside of the 8" View & Do Circle Shape.



Do not cut squares of interfacing for the three 4" circles; instead use the cut-out circles from the middle of the 8" interfacing.

Circles:

Enough to fussy-cut  
three 8" fabric circles  
three 6" fabric circles  
three 4" fabric circles

Solid circles  
green ¼ yd  
dk purple ¼ yd

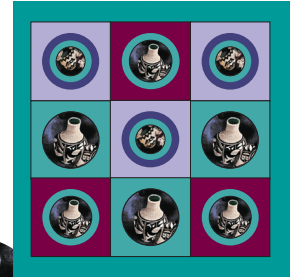
Background squares  
green ¼ yd  
red ¼ yd  
lt. purple ¼ yd

Lt weight interfacing• ¾ yd  
Borders ½ yd cut into 3" strips  
Batting 42" x 42"  
Backing 42" x 42"  
Binding ¼ yd

### Face the Circles:

1. Pin the light weight interfacing to the fabric circle, lining up the outside drawn circle with the outside edge of the fabric circle.
2. Sew ¼" inside of the drawn circle.
3. Trim seam allowances.
4. Cut out smaller circle of interfacing.
5. Turn circle right side out.
6. Press



Fussy-cut circle.



Pin drawn circle to fabric circle.

Stitch ¼" inside of drawn circle.



Trim interfacing even with fabric circle.

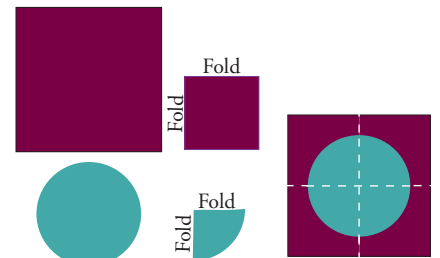


Cut out interfacing along smaller circle.

Turn circle right side out.

### Applique the Circles to the Blocks.

1. Cut 12" squares of fabric  
Cut 3 green  
Cut 3 burgundy  
Cut 3 lt purple
2. Fold and crease these squares.
3. Fold and crease each of the fabric circles.
4. Center and pin the circles on the background by lining up the crease lines.
5. Use a machine blanket stitch to sew the circle to the background.



Make the following circle blocks:

Sew the blocks into rows.

Add borders.

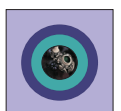
Make 3 8" fussy-cut circle



Make 3 6" fussy-cut circle on top of a plain 8" circle



Make 3 4" fussy-cut circle on top of plain 6" and 8" circle.
