Cutting

Fabric A (3640-77 Heartland Blocks – Navy), fussy cut:

- (16) 8 ½" squares, each centered on an animal.

Fabric B (26-Garnet Peppered Cottons – Garnet), cut:

- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (32) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (32) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (1) 3 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 3 ¼" squares and (9) 2 ¾" squares. Cut the 3 ¼" squares across both diagonals to make (16) large triangles. Cut the 2 ¾" squares across both diagonals to make (36) small triangles.

Fabric C (41-Blue Jay Peppered Cottons – Blue Jay), cut:

- (4) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (14) 5" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric D (82-Midnight Peppered Cottons – Midnight), cut:

- (7) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (56) 5" squares.

Fabric E (70-Frost Peppered Cottons – Frost), cut:

- (3) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (11) 5" x 9 ½" strips.

Fabric F (3642-77 Stars and Stripes – Navy), cut:

- (3) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (22) 5" squares.

Fabric G (3645-11 Medallion – Lt. Blue), cut:

- (7) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (26) 5" x 9 ½" strips.
- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

Fabric H (3644-77 Small Floral Flourish – Navy), cut:

- (3) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) 5" squares.

Fabric I (45-Ink Peppered Cottons – Ink), cut:

- (3) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (9) 5" x 9 ½" strips.
- (3) 5" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (24) 5" squares.

Fabric J (3641-44 Character Toss – Cream), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (8) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) 2 ¾" x 5" strips.
- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (6) 5" squares.

Fabric K (3643-44 Daisy Allover – Cream), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (8) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) 2 ¾" x 5" strips.
- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (6) 5" squares.

Fabric L (3644-44 Small Floral Flourish – Cream), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) 3 ½" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 2 ½" squares and (9) 2" squares.
- (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) 2 ¾" squares.
- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (5) 5" squares.

Cutting - Continued

Fabric M (3645-44 Medallion – Cream), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) 3 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) 2 ¾" squares.
- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (6) 5" squares.

Fabric N (39-Sand Peppered Cottons – Sand), cut:

- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) 5" squares.
- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (1) 5" square and (4) 3 ¼" squares.
Cut the 3 ¼" squares across both diagonals to make (16) large triangles. Cut the 2 ¾" squares across both diagonals to make (36) small triangles.
- (1) 2 ¾" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (9) 2 ¾" squares

Fabric O (3642-88 Stars and Stripes – Red), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) 3 ½" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 2 ½" squares and (9) 2" squares.
- (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) 2 ¾" squares.
- (8) 8" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 8" x 63 ½" strips.

Fabric P (3643-88 Daisy Allover – Red), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) 3 ½" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 2 ½" squares and (9) 2" squares.
- (2) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (18) 2 ¾" squares.

Fabric Q (3644-88 Small Floral Flourish – Red), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (16) 3 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ¾" x WOF strips. Sub-cut the strips into (36) 2 ¾" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (8) 2 ½" squares.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (18) 2" squares.

Fabric R (16-Flame Peppered Cottons – Flame), cut:

- (1) 3 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 3 ¼" squares and (9) 2 ¾" squares. Cut the 3 ¼" squares across both diagonals to make (16) large triangles and cut the 2 ¾" squares across both diagonals to make (36) small triangles.

Fabric S (09-White Sugar Peppered Cottons – White Sugar), cut:

- (1) 3 ¼" x WOF strip. Sub-cut the strip into (4) 3 ¼" squares and (9) 2 ¾" squares. Cut the 3 ¼" squares across both diagonals to make (16) large triangles and cut the 2 ¾" squares across both diagonals to make (36) small triangles.

Backing (3646-66 Scenic Allover – Green/Multi), cut:

- (3) 95" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 95" x 95" back.

Sewing

Sew using a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise indicated. Always press towards the darker fabric while assembling, unless otherwise noted by the arrows.

Sewing Instructions

1. Place (1) 5" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 5" x 9 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance.

2. Place another 5" Fabric D square on the right side of the 5" x 9 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 4). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1.

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (14) Unit 1's total.

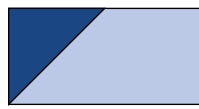

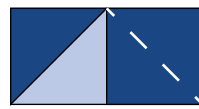

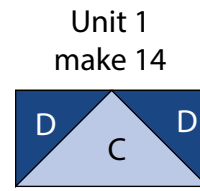

4. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (11) 5" x 9 ½" Fabric E strips and (22) 5" Fabric F squares to make (11) Unit 2's (Fig. 5).

5. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (12) 5" x 9 ½" Fabric G strips and (24) 5" Fabric I squares to make (12) Unit 3's (Fig. 6).

6. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (9) 5" x 9 ½" Fabric I strips and (18) 5" Fabric H squares to make (9) Unit 4's (Fig. 7).

7. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (14) 5" x 9 ½" Fabric G strips and (28) 5" Fabric D squares to make (14) Unit 5's (Fig. 8).

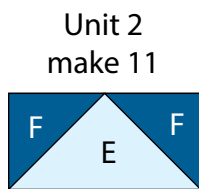

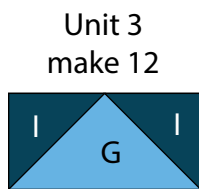

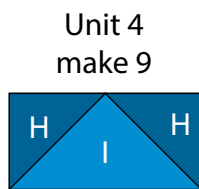

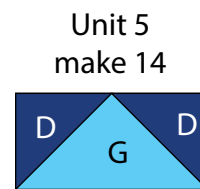

8. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric K strips, (4) 3 ½" Fabric Q squares and (4) 3 ½" Fabric P squares to make (4) Unit 6's (Fig. 9).

9. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric K strips, (4) 3 ½" Fabric O squares and (4) 3 ½" Fabric Q squares to make (4) Unit 7's (Fig. 10).

10. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric J strips and (8) 3 ½" Fabric Q squares to make (4) Unit 8's (Fig. 11).

11. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (4) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric J strips, (4) 3 ½" Fabric O squares and (4) 3 ½" Fabric P squares to make (4) Unit 9's (Fig. 12).

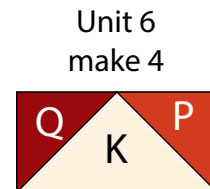

make 4

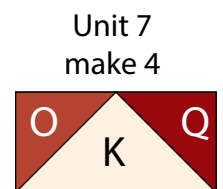

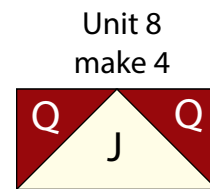

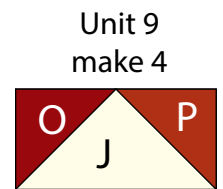

12. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (9) 2 ¾" x 5" Fabric K strips, (9) 2 ¾" Fabric Q squares and (9) 2 ¾" Fabric P squares to make (9) Unit 10's (Fig. 13).

13. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (9) 2 ¾" x 5" Fabric K strips, (9) 2 ¾" Fabric O squares and (9) 2 ¾" Fabric Q squares to make (9) Unit 11's (Fig. 14).

14. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (9) 2 ¾" x 5" Fabric J strips and (18) 2 ¾" Fabric Q squares to make (9) Unit 12's (Fig. 15).

15. Repeat Steps 1-2 using (9) 2 ¾" x 5" Fabric J strips, (9) 2 ¾" Fabric O squares and (9) 2 ¾" Fabric P squares to make (9) Unit 13's (Fig. 16).

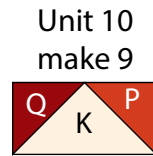

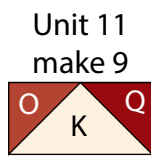

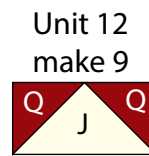

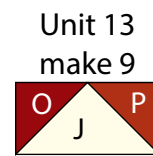

16. Sew (2) Fabric S large triangles and (2) Fabric B large triangles together to make (1) large SS block (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (8) large SS blocks total.

17. Sew (2) large Fabric R triangles and (2) large Fabric N triangles together to make (1) large RR block (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (8) large RR blocks total.

18. Sew (1) large RR block to each side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric L square. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric Q square to each side of (1) large SS block. Sew this strip to the top of the Fabric L square. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric O square to the left side of (1) large SS block and (1) 2 ½" Fabric P square to the right side. Sew the resulting strip to the bottom of the Fabric L square to make (1) Unit 14 (Fig. 19.) Repeat to make (4) Unit 14's total.

19. Sew (2) Fabric S small triangles and (2) Fabric B small triangles together to make (1) small SS block (Fig. 20). Repeat to make (18) small SS blocks total.

20. Sew (2) small Fabric R triangles and (2) small Fabric N triangles together to make (1) small RR block (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (18) small RR blocks total.

21. Sew (1) small RR block to each side of (1) 2" Fabric L square. Sew (1) 2" Fabric Q square to each side of (1) small SS block. Sew this strip to the top of the Fabric L square. Sew (1) 2" Fabric O square to the left side of (1) small SS block and (1) 2" Fabric P square to the right side. Sew the resulting strip to the bottom of the Fabric L square to make (1) Unit 15 (Fig. 22.) Repeat to make (9) Unit 15's total.

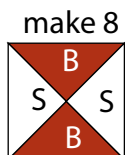

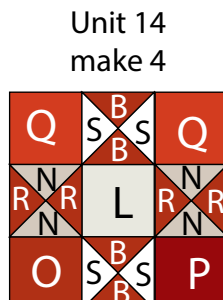

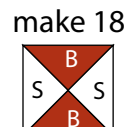

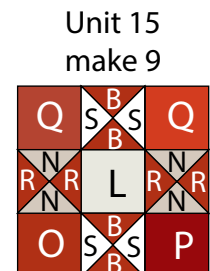

22. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square. Trim the block to measure 9 ½" square to make (1) Block One (Fig. 23). Repeat to make (16) Block Ones total.

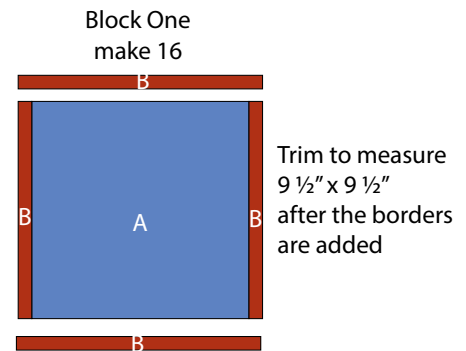

23. Sew Unit 8 to the left side of (1) Unit 14. Sew (1) Unit 9 to the right side. Sew (1) 3 ½" Fabric M square to the left end of (1) Unit 6. Sew (1) 3 ½" Fabric L square to the right end. Sew this strip to the top of the Unit 14. Sew (1) 3 ½" Fabric L square to the left end of (1) Unit 7. Sew (1) 3 ½" Fabric M square to the right end. Sew this strip to the bottom of the Unit 14 to make (1) Block Two (Fig. 24). Repeat to make (4) Block Twos total.

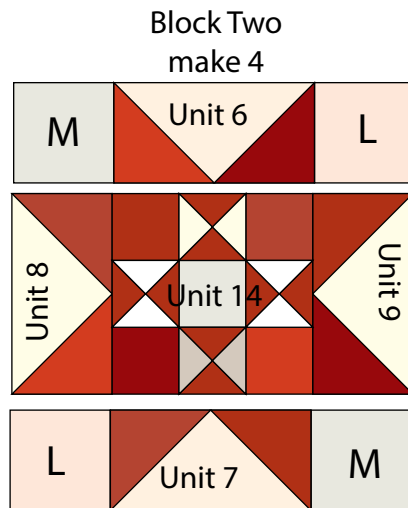

24. Sew Unit 12 to the left side of (1) Unit 15. Sew (1) Unit 13 to the right side. Sew (1) 2 ¾" Fabric M square to the left end of (1) Unit 10. Sew (1) 2 ¾" Fabric L square to the right end. Sew this strip to the top of the Unit 15. Sew (1) 2 ¾" Fabric L square to the left end of (1) Unit 11. Sew (1) 2 ¾" Fabric M square to the right end. Sew this strip to the bottom of the Unit 15 to make (1) Block Three (Fig. 25). Repeat to make (9) Block Threes total.

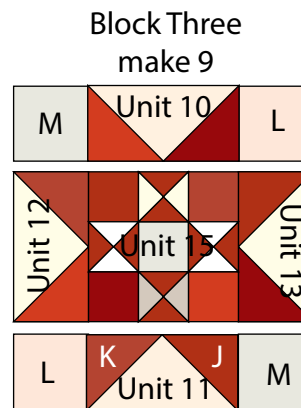

Quilt Top Assembly

(Refer to the Quilt Layout while assembling. Pay attention to the orientation of the Units and the Blocks.)

25. Sew (6) assorted 5" squares and (5) assorted Units together, alternating them, to make (1) sashing strip. Repeat to make (4) sashing strips total.

26. Sew (6) assorted Units, (2) Block Threes and (3) Block Ones together to make Row One. Repeat to make Rows Two, Four and Five. Pay attention to the position of the Blocks and Units.

27. Sew (6) assorted Units, (4) Blocks Ones and (1) Block Three together to make Row Three.

28. Sew the (5) rows, in numerical order, and (4) sashing rows together, alternating them, to make the Center Block.

29. Sew (1) 8" x 63 ½" Fabric O strip to each side of the Center Block.

30. Sew (5) assorted Units and (4) assorted 5" squares together, alternating them. Sew this strip to the bottom of (1) 8" x 63 1/2" Fabric O strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block Two to each end of the resulting strip. Sew this strip to the top of the Center Block.

31. Sew (5) assorted Units and (4) assorted 5" squares together, alternating them. Sew this strip to the top of (1) 8" x 63 1/2" Fabric O strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block Two to each end of the resulting strip. Sew this strip to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

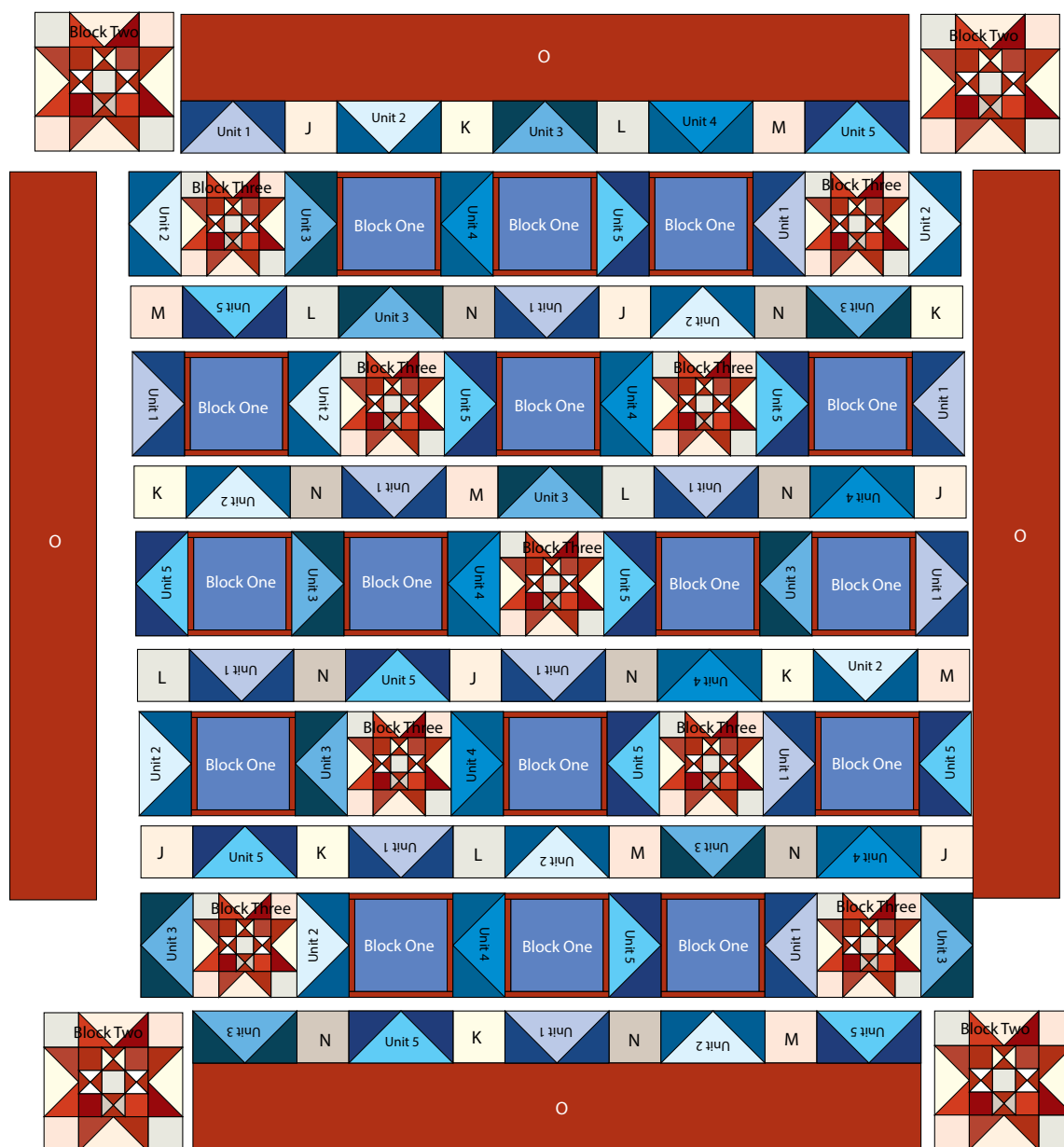
Layering, Quilting and Finishing

11. Press the quilt top and 95" x 95" backing well. Layer backing (wrong side up), batting, pressed quilt top (right side up) and baste. Quilt as desired and trim excess batting and backing when quilting is complete.

Binding

12. Cut the ends of the (9) Fabric G binding strips at a 45-degree angle and sew end to end to make (1) continuous piece of binding. Fold in half lengthwise and press wrong sides together.

13. Sew the binding to the front of the quilt, raw edges together. Turn the folded edge to the back, and hand stitch in place.
