

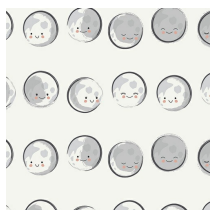

## Cutting Directions



### **1 Full moons**

- 4 squares 2.5" x 2.5"  
TIP - I fussy cut a  
motif from the fabric



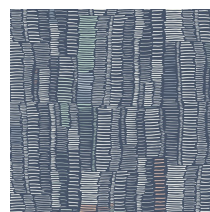
### **2 Gray Space print**

- 1 square 4.5" x 4.5"  
TIP - I fussy cut a  
motif from the fabric



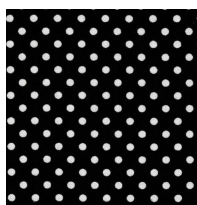
### **3 Half moon**

- 2 squares 5" x 5" for HST  
- 8 squares 2.5" x 2.5"



### **4 Blue lines**

- 4 rectangles 2.5" x 4.5"



### **10 Black polka dot**

- 8 rectangles 1.5" x 2.5"



### **13 Gray Background**

- 2 squares 5" x 5" for HST

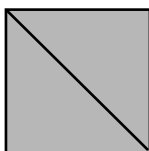

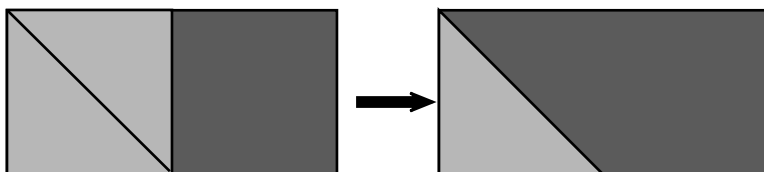
## **Directions**

### **Flying Geese Units**



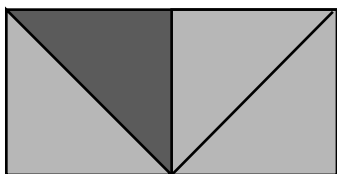
#### **Step 1**

- 1) Draw a diagonal line on each 2.5" half moon square  
Make 8



#### **Step 2**

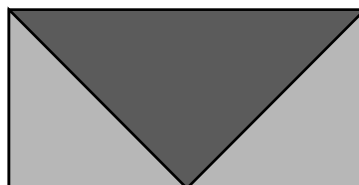
- 1) Following the diagram, Place a half moon square on 2.5" x 4.5" blue line rectangle
- 2) Sew on the line.
- 3) Flip over and press, check the back to be sure it matches up to the rectangle
- 4) Trim away the excess corner fabric behind the triangle. Leave a 1/4" seam.
- 3) Make 4 Measures 2.5" x 4.5"



#### **Step 3**

- 1) Following the diagram, repeat step 2 for the second square to make the flying geese
- 2) Make 4

Measures 2.5" x 4.5"

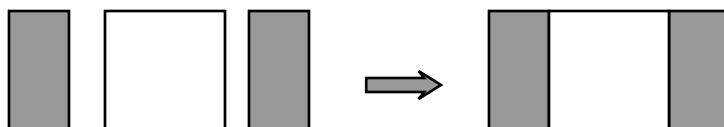

## Assemble

4) Following the diagram sew a Polka dot rectangle on either side of a moon square.

Make 4

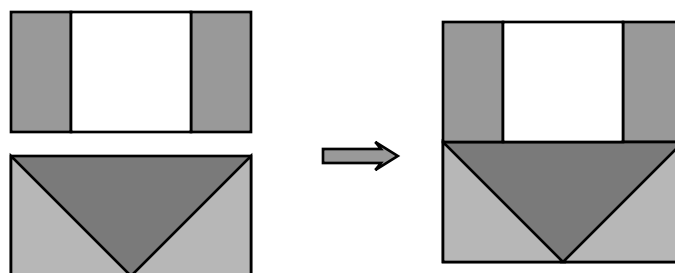
Measures 2.5" x 4.5"



5) Following the diagram sew the Flying geese unit to the moon rectangle unit

Make 4

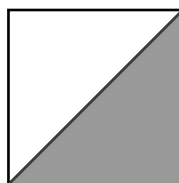
Measures 4.5" x 4.5"



6) Using the 5" squares make HSTs using the method on last page.

Make 4 units

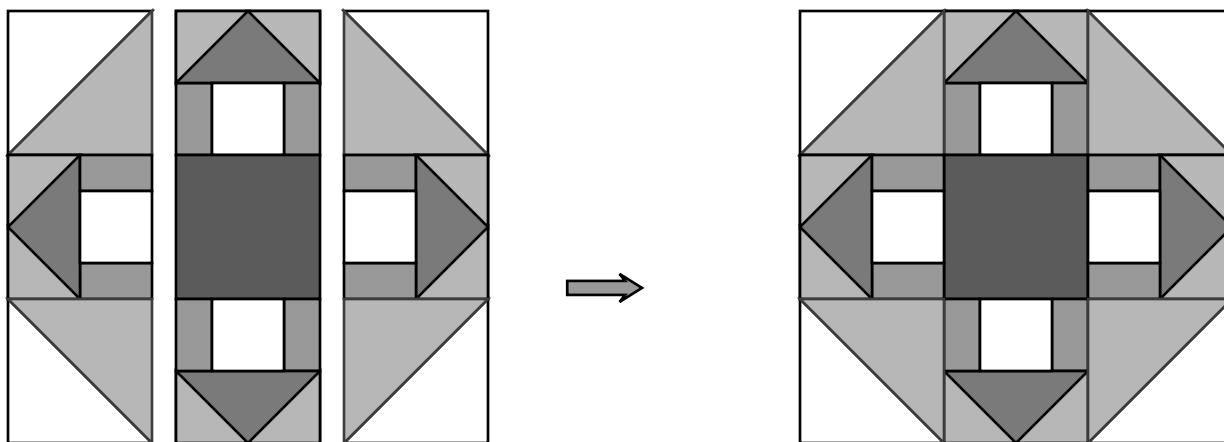
trim to 4.5" square



7) Following the diagram sew the block

Make 1,

measures 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"

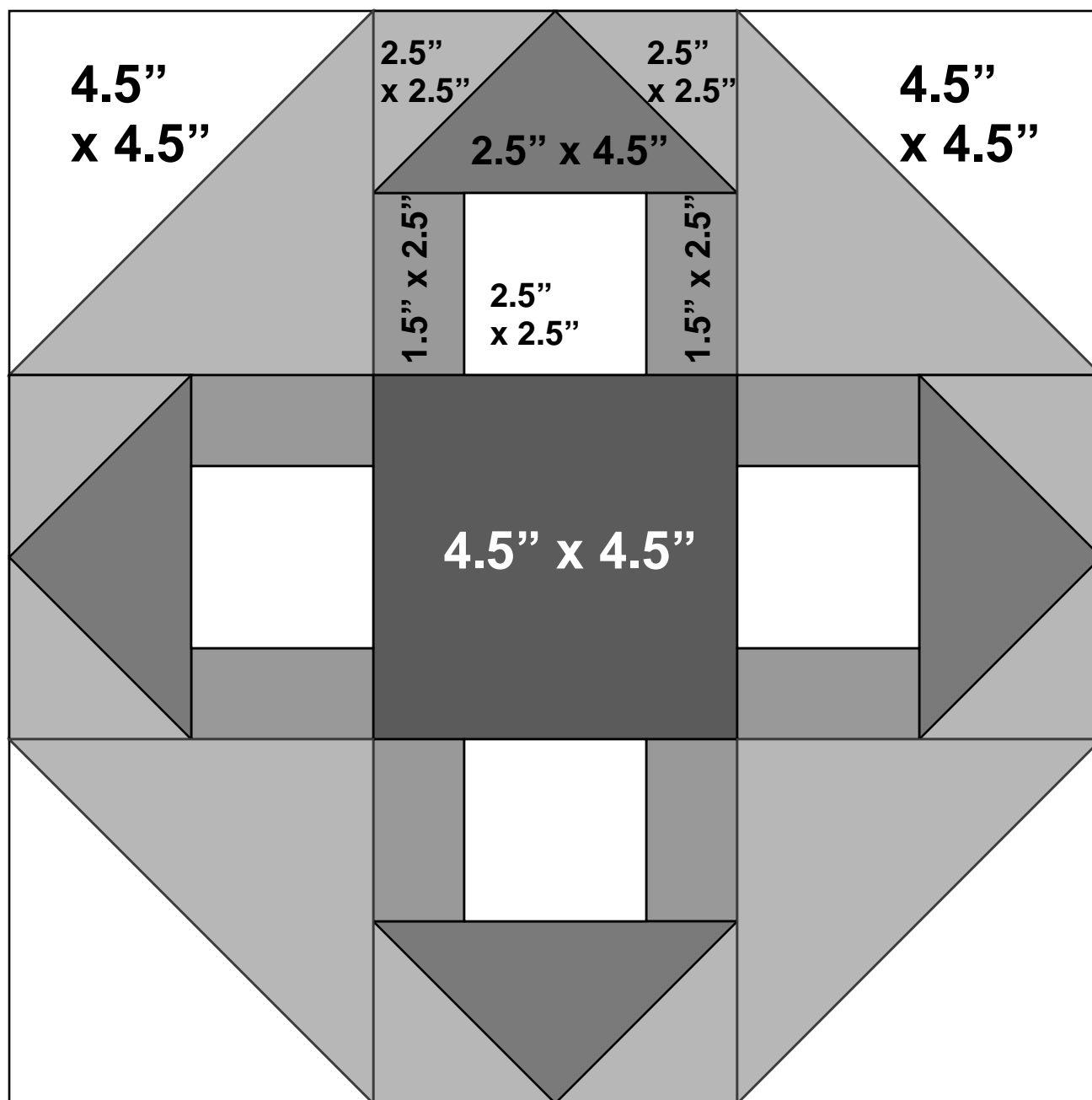

## Block #7 Cut Sizes



Trim Block to 12.5" x 12.5"

Finished Size 12" in the quilt

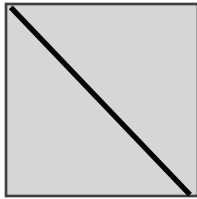

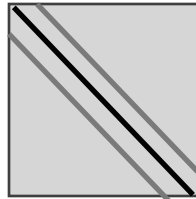
## Half Square Triangles Tutorial

**NOTE- For other ways to make HST units, see my book  
"Pat Sloan's Teach Me to Sew Triangles"**



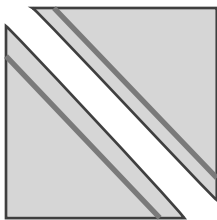
**Step 1**

- Draw a line on the back  
of all the lighter squares



**Step 2**

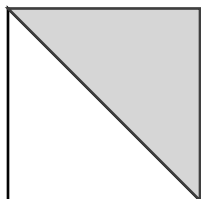
- Layer the 2 squares  
- Sew a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam on both  
Sides of the drawn line



**Step 3**

Cut on the drawn  
Line for 2 HST

**Step 4**



-Trim squares to size in directions  
using a square ruler with  
a diagonal line placed on the  
Seam.
