

Cutting Directions




1 Full moons

4 squares 2.5" x 2.5"
TIP - I fussy cut a motif from the fabric

? Half moon

- 2 squares 5" x 5" for HST
- 8 squares 2.5" x 2.5"



10 Black polka dot

- 8 rectangles 1.5" x 2.5"



9 Gray Space print

- 1 square 4.5" x 4.5" TIP - I fussy cut a motif from the fabric



⚠ Blue lines

- 4 rectangles 2.5" x 4.5"



12 Gray Background

- 2 squares 5" x 5" for HST


Directions

Flying Geese Units




Step 1

1) Draw a diagonal line on each 2.5" half moon square Make 8



Step 2


- 1) Following the diagram,
- Place a half moon square on 2.5" x 4.5" blue line rectangle
- 2) Sew on the line.
- 3) Flip over and press, check the back to be sure it matches up to the rectangle
- 4) Trim away the excess corner fabric behind the triangle. Leave a 1/4" seam.
- 3) Make 4 Measures 2.5" x 4.5"





- 1) Following the diagram, repeat step 2 for the second square to make the flying geese
- 2) Make 4

Measures 2.5" x 4.5"




4) Following the diagram sew a Polka dot rectangle on either side of a moon square.

Make 4


Measures 2.5" x 4.5"



5) Following the diagram sew the Flying geese unit to the moon rectangle unit Make 4 Measures 4.5" x 4.5"





6) Using the 5" squares make HSTs using the method on last page. Make 4 units trim to 4.5" square



7) Following the diagram sew the block Make 1,

measures 12 1/2" x 12 1/2"








Half Square Triangles Tutorial

NOTE- For other ways to make HST units, see my book "Pat Sloan's Teach Me to Sew Triangles"




Step 1

- Draw a line on the back of all the lighter squares



Step 2


- Layer the 2 squares
- Sew a ¼" seam on both Sides of the drawn line



Step 3

Cut on the drawn Line for 2 HST





-Trim squares to size in directions using a square ruler with a diagonal line placed on the Seam.
